SCHOOL HISTORY

Mary, Queen of Peace Church Parish was established in 1988. In January of 1996, Archbishop Francis B. Schulte dedicated the new church building. In that same year, Mary, Queen of Peace Catholic School was founded. In August, 1996, Mary, Queen of Peace Catholic School opened in the Parish Center. The original school included grades kindergarten, first and second. The school has added grades each year and now offers pre-kindergarten through seventh grades.

In 1998, our new school building was completed. This building houses administrative offices, a full service cafeteria, classrooms for the elementary school – pre-kindergarten to first grades and the After Care room. The Parish Center houses our pre-kindergarten 3 year old classrooms, our library and computer lab. The modular building houses second to seventh grades.

MISSION

Mary, Queen of Peace Catholic School seeks to provide a nurturing environment that allows each child to grow spiritually, academically, emotionally, and physically in Christ's love through high academic standards and emphasis on serving God and community. Our children are encouraged to develop good moral character and are taught to live their Catholic faith.

CURRICULUM

The curriculum follows the Archdiocesan curriculum guidelines and state and national standards. Elementary students are taught religion, math, reading, and language arts daily. Science and social studies are taught through thematic units in kindergarten through fourth grades. Middle School students are taught religion, math, reading, language arts, science and social studies.

Students learn about their Catholic faith and how to live it as part of their daily classroom experience, through activities centered on

the liturgical seasons of the Church, and attendance at weekly Mass and special celebrations.

There is strong technological support to enhance the curriculum and prepare students to meet the needs of a technological world. Our middle school students are assigned laptops which are utilized in all classes. Grades Pre-K through Fourth have computers with teacher directed Internet access available. Computerized Interactive boards are featured in all classrooms. The school library, with around 9000 volumes, and computer lab are located in the Parish Center. The Accelerated Reader and STAR Reading Programs are integral parts of our curriculum which promote and enhance student reading. Strong emphasis is placed on educating the total child. Besides the library and computer exposure, students attend enrichment classes in physical education, art, foreign language, and music weekly. Band is also offered to our students at an additional charge.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Bell rings at 7:30. Students are considered tardy at 7:35. School hours are 7:30 a.m. until 2:40 p.m. - After Care is provided at an additional charge until 6:00 p.m. The school cafeteria serves nutritional meals under the supervision of the Archdiocesan Food Services. St. Tammany Parish provides bus transportation to those students living within the local public school district.

Early Childhood Program

The Early Childhood program at Mary, Queen of Peace Catholic School prepares your child in five areas of development: religious, social, mental, physical, and emotional. Each child is accepted as a unique gift from God with individual strengths and needs. Your child will be guided, helped, and encouraged to advance according to his or her individual development. Each child is encouraged and helped to become independent, self-reliant and to develop a positive self-image.

The curriculum is built around activities that include observing the world around them and seeking solutions to concrete problems. Children are provided the opportunity to see how reading and writing are useful. The children learn about math, science, social studies, health, and other content areas, all integrated through meaningful activities. Routines are followed that help children stay safe and healthy.

Our early childhood education program is geared toward laying the foundation for your child's eventual awakening of faith. Through their own personal experiences the spiritual growth of each child is a gradual discovery of, and a personal relationship with, God. Prayer is a customary and integral part of the day. 2010-2011 REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Please bring the following information with the registration form to registration. All information must be received in order for the application to be accepted as complete. Only complete applications will be considered for admission to Mary, Queen of Peace Catholic School.

All materials marked * will be copied and returned on registration day. We cannot make a copy from a copy for * items.

- *Official copy of Birth Certificate.
- *Official copy of Baptismal Certificate.
- *Original Social Security Card.
- Immunization form Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals, Office of Public Health – Student Health form for school registration. (State of Louisiana Universal Certificate of Immunization) This may be acquired from either your child’s physician or the St. Tammany Health Unit, (893-6208). No personal health cards will be accepted.
- Families who meet the support guidelines of other Church parishes should provide their Voucher from their home parish at registration. However, the voucher may be furnished up to the deadline for tuition payment on May 3, 2010.
- A copy of the current report card and Standardized Test results for students who are entering first grade or above.
- A check for the registration fee of \$165. 00 for the youngest sibling in Catholic school (\$150.00 for each additional sibling)

Applications for Kindergarten through Seventh grade that are received after 3:00 p.m. February 22, 2010 will be considered only if space exists after acceptance of those students whose applications were received on New Student Registration Day.

ORDER OF ACCEPTING STUDENTS:

The order in which registration applications are received in the school office on the application date is not a factor in the selection process.

The order is determined through the following criteria:

1. Currently enrolled students in M.Q.P. Catholic School.
2. Children of M.Q.P. parishioners who live within the geographical boundaries of the parish and have a sibling currently enrolled at M.Q.P. Catholic School.
3. Children of Catholic parents who live outside of M.Q.P. parish who have a sibling currently enrolled at M.Q.P. Catholic School.
4. Children of non-Catholic parents who have a sibling currently enrolled in M.Q.P. Catholic School.
5. Children of registered, active, and supporting M.Q.P. parishioners who live within the geographical boundaries of the parish.
6. Children of registered, active, and supporting M.Q.P. parishioners who live outside of the geographical boundaries of the parish.
7. Children of M.Q.P. parishioners who live within the geographical boundaries of the parish.
8. Children of M.Q.P. parishioners who live outside of the geographical boundaries of the parish.
9. Children of Catholic parents who live in the Mary, Queen of Peace Church Parish geographical boundary.
10. Children of Catholic parents who are parishioners in a parish with no Catholic school.
11. Children of Catholic parents who are parishioners in a parish with a Catholic school.
12. Children of non-Catholic parents.

Definition of registered, active, and supporting parishioner is determined by Mary, Queen of Peace Church Parish. Please contact the Church office for more information.

EXPLANATION OF FEES

All fees are separate from tuition

REGISTRATION FEE – A non-refundable fee of \$165.00 per child for the youngest child in Catholic school and then \$150.00 per each additional child

NON-PARISH FEE – A non-refundable fee of \$300.00 per child is to be paid by:

1. All Non-Catholics (added to the Non-Catholic tuition)
2. All Catholic families who do not meet the support guidelines of Mary, Queen of Peace Church Parish.
3. Families, who meet the support guidelines of another church parish that does not have a school, may have this fee paid by the other church parish through a voucher. It is the responsibility of the parent to obtain the voucher from their parish.
4. Families, who meet the support guidelines of another church parish that has a school, but no room in the child's grade, may have this fee paid by the other church parish through a voucher. It is the responsibility of the parent to obtain the voucher from their parish.
